### The beginning: From Streets to Homes! Association

#### From Streets to Homes Association

- NGO established in 2014 in Budapest, Hungary grassroots, activists
- aim: help homeless & housing poor people access housing
- motto: safe and decent housing is a basic human right
- Based on **Housing First** methodology
- We develop and test housing policy model programs to end homelessness
- Currently we have a team of 30 people
- 100+ formerly homeless tenants in affordable rental housing
- Rent subsidy & integration support for 350+ refugees from Ukraine





#### From Streets to Homes! Association: model programs

Five main activities:

- 1. From Huts to Homes Housing First for homeless persons and families
- 2. Housing Now! Social Rental Agency
- 3. Housing and integration support for refugees from Ukraine
- 4. Community social work: self and mutual help groups employment, women's group, peer mentoring
- 5. Awareness raising for general public & decision makers



#### Housing Now! Social Rental Agency

HN mobilizes privately owned housing to provide affordable rental homes for people in need

- a) apartments owned by HN's Foundation
- b) renting and subletting from private homeowners, below market price:
  - i) 80-50% below market average: key workers
  - ii) 50% or below market average: social housing
- c) NGO owned housing

## Housing Now! Social Rental Agency

Target groups:

- private homeowners
- tenants:
  - a) social tenants: people staying in temporary housing or institutions for a prolonged period
  - b) key workers: partnership with Social Workers' Unions & Union of Nursery Workers

Rent level 80% of market average or less - type of tenancy based on rent level No rent deposit

Timeframe of contract: 2 years or more

Informal letting (tax evasion) not accepted; tax administration by HN

Housing quality: only small reparations undertaken at HN's expense





#### Housing Now! Social and Key Worker housing

Rent level	50% of market average or lower (lowest usually 20%)	80-50% of market average	
Tenant selected by	From streets to Homes Association	Union partner	
Monthly housing management overhead	HUF 10,000 - cca. EUR 25	HUF 5,000 - cca. EUR 12,5	
Intensive social work	provided to tenants - Housing First principles	not relevant	
Other support	In address and utilities registration, furnishing the dwelling, in kind donations if necessary	Usually not relevant; occasionally minimal support in administrative issues	
Small renovations by FSHA before moving in	Yes	No	











#### **Benefits for tenants**

- Affordable rent level
- Long term, safe tenancy
- no deposit
- full administrative support, mediation with owner, neighbors if needed
- complex social work and support for social tenants

Tenant's right to safety and human dignity



#### **Benefits for owners**

HN undertakes

- tenant selection and vetting,
- all legal and administrative tasks
- registering utilities on the tenants name
- assessment of the condition of the home and its equipments
- guarantees regular rent payment no vacancy periods

HN also takes on small renovations and reparations at own expense; larger

interventions can be arranged, and will be deducted from rent payment

 $\rightarrow$  Guarantee for upkeep and maintenance of home during contracting period
